Book from the scientific series of the Centre for Psychiatry Suedwuerttemberg (ZfP) translated into English for the first time

ZWIEFALTEN - For the first time, a book from the ZfP-publishing house "Psychiatrie und Geschichte" Zwiefalten has been published in English. Volume 6 of the publisher's own scientific series was published this month by *Karnac Books Limited* in England

The 2021 publication by ZfP-Verlag, which is also the book version of Andrea Huppke's dissertation in the Department of Psychology at the University of Konstanz, entitled "Global vernetzte Psychoanalyse. The International Federation of Psychoanalytic Societies (IFPS) between 1960 and 1980", has now been published by a well-known and renowned British publishing house in Bicester, Oxfordshire (UK). The English version appears under the title: "Psychoanalysis Globally Networked. The Origins of the International Federation of Psychoanalytic Societies". (Bicester, 2024)

The sixth volume of the scientific series "Psychiatry, Culture and Society in Historical Perspective", edited by Thomas Müller, Uta Kanis-Seyfried and Bernd Reichelt at the Research Unit of the History and Ethics of Medicine at the Centre of Psychiatry Suedwuerttemberg, has now been made available to the wider English-speaking world following a contractual agreement. The in-house ZfP-publishing house does not have the necessary global distribution structure for this. Andrea Huppke's doctorate was supervised by Prof Klaus Hoffmann (Reichenau), and reviewed by Prof Hoffmann and Prof Thomas Müller (ZfP Suedwuerttemberg), for the Department of Psychology at the University of Konstanz.

Content: This volume traces the history of the founding and development of the IFPS and places it in the theoretical context of the conflict between the divergent psychoanalytic currents worldwide. The psychoanalytic movement has known tensions and divisions from all stages of its development. In the decades following the Second World War, these were expressed above all between a psychoanalysis that was clearly oriented towards Sigmund Freud's teachings and a second one that wanted more revisions. Internationally, many of the psychoanalysts who followed Freud's teachings more closely were organised in the International Psychoanalytic Association (IPA). Those who strove for "further developments" and called their form of psychoanalysis "liberal" psychoanalysis initially had no organised international network. In the early 1960s, however, German, Austrian, American, French, Dutch and Mexican psychoanalysts who were not members of the IPA began to organise joint congresses. In 1962, the groups from Germany, Austria and Mexico

decided to found an association that was open to interdisciplinarity and wanted to allow revisions of Freudian teachings: the IFPS was born.
